Assertion – Pauline model of persistence

- ▶ Define persistence
- ▶ Identify Paul in the Bible
- ▶ Pauline Persistence formula
 - ▶ Carry on
 - ▶ Remain in the body
 - ▶ Understand divine peace

Assertion cont. –

Persist by carrying on in the ministry

- ▶ Continue preaching
- ▶ Defend the truth
- ▶ Audiences are fickle

Assertion cont.

Persist by remaining in the body of Christ

- ▶ Produces much fruit
- ▶ Help the fruit to mature
- ▶ Allows Jesus's name to be known

Assertion cont.

Persisting by understanding divine peace

- ▶ Rejoice for peace!
- ▶ Regulate anxiety
- ▶ Prayer and thanksgiving bring peace
